

## **TRAINER'S TEST CHECKLIST**

- □ **Starting the Process** To start the process for a NMRC Trainers license you must have the following: At least five years' experience as a licensed groom, jockey, exercise rider, or pony person.
- □ **Shall be required** to pass an oral interview with the board of stewards and pass a demonstration of practical skills and the New Mexico racing commission's sanctioned written trainers' examination, with a minimum score of 80 percent in each category.
- Must submit two written statements from trainers currently licensed in New Mexico as to the character and qualifications of the applicant and one written statement from a currently licensed owner stating intent to place one or more horses with the applicant, when licensed.
- Stewards Oral Examination Contact the Board of Stewards at one of the New Mexico Racing Commission's Racetracks and request to schedule an "Oral Interview".

If you should fail the Oral Examination the following will apply:

- □ Applicants failing the "first" oral examination must wait <u>90 days</u> before retaking the Oral Examination.
- □ Applicants failing the "second" oral examination must wait <u>180 days</u> before retaking the Oral Examination.
- □ Applicants failing the "third" oral examination must wait <u>1 year</u> before retaking the Oral Examination.
- □ Scheduling the Written Test Must have two written statements, copy of barn test and the Oral Examination paperwork signed by the Board of Stewards. After you have completed the above requirements then you may contact Leasa Johnson (505) 629-9822 to schedule a trainer's test.

If you should fail the trainer's test the following will apply:

- □ Applicants failing the "first" trainer's test must wait <u>90 days</u> before retaking the trainer's test.
- □ Applicants failing the "second" trainer's test must wait <u>180 days</u> before retaking the.
- □ Applicants failing the "third" trainer's test must wait <u>1 year</u> before retaking the trainer's test.
